

## Father Paul Writes - 1<sup>st</sup> October, 2023

Welcome to St Saviour's Glen Osmond and also to your pets as we give thanks to them and bless them as part of the Blessing of the Animals Service at 10 am. A special focus for this service is a public expression of

the bond we have with all animals and so we make this an integral part of our worship today. The service also remembers St Francis of Assisi who is the patron saint of animals and ecology. He was an Italian Friar in the 13<sup>th</sup> century and was the founder of the Franciscan Order. He loved animals and nature, and believed we all have a responsibility to look after them. It is only appropriate we celebrate him today with the Blessing of the Animals and as we continue to celebrate the Season of Creation until Wednesday, a season which began on September the 1<sup>st</sup> and gives thanks for God's creation where we pray for us to be better stewards of Mother Earth.

Our Alpha Course continues this afternoon at 5 pm. The session today is titled "How Can I Resist Evil?". It asks the question why should we believe the devil exists, what are the devil's tactics and how do we defend ourselves from evil.
