

## Father Paul Writes - 8<sup>th</sup> of October, 2023

I welcome you all today as we baptise Nikoleta Grace Beka, in welcoming her as a member of God's family. I especially welcome Nikoleta's parents, godparents, and grandparents along with Nikoleta's Aunt, the Rev'd Sue Burgess who will

baptise her. Baptism marks the beginning of one's spiritual journey within the Christian faith. It is a moment when a child or adult is initiated into the Christian community, receiving the grace of God and becoming a beloved member of the Church. It is a timeless and essential sacrament in our modern world where we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit, a grace from God, which enables us to be guided by God and His Son Jesus Christ in our lives.

We continue our Alpha course this afternoon at 5 pm. The topic this week is how we share our Christian faith with others. It is a topic that I'm sure many of us need help with. The session in the meeting room starts at 5 pm with welcome drinks and nibbles, followed by a light tea, a video and discussion. All are welcome, no matter whether you have come along before.

Speaking of Alpha, Niky and Sila Lee from Alpha are coming to Adelaide to speak about their pre-marriage and marriage courses. Their ministry has reached over four million people in more than 120 countries in over 40 languages. They are experienced in developing a church culture where the community is reached and marriages flourish. They will be in Adelaide on Tuesday and Wednesday the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of October at the Burnside City Uniting Church at 7 pm. The first session on Tuesday is called "A Discipleship Journey with Alpha and The Marriage Course" and the second session on the Wednesday is called "The Marriage Masterclass". This is a great opportunity to hear two very talented speakers and to learn more about the courses they offer. Next Saturday, we will be holding a barbecue and a trading table while our church grounds are utilized as a polling booth for the referendum to change the constitution and accept an indigenous advisory body (a voice) for the Federal Government. The Rev'd Ben Falcon, the Acting Manager of Mission & Anglican Community Development will be our guest preacher at both the 8 am and 10 am services. St Saviour's is a great supporter of the Magdalene Centre in providing food and with the Christmas hampers.
