

A reading from the book Joshua

Then Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. And Joshua said to all the people, 'Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: Long ago your ancestors - Terah and his sons Abraham and Nahor lived beyond the Euphrates and served other gods. 'Now therefore revere the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness; put away the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. Now if you are unwilling to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served in the region beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.' Then the people answered, 'Far be it from us that we should forsake the Lord to serve other gods; for it is the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, and who did those great signs in our sight. He protected us along all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; and the Lord drove out before us all the peoples, the Amorites who lived in the land. A reading from the letter to the Ephesians

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to guench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.' He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?' But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, 'Does this offend you? Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. And he said, 'For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.' Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, 'Do you also wish to go away?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God.'

Father Paul writes – August 25



I welcome you on this 14th Sunday after Pentecost where we hear of people finding it hard to understand Jesus' teaching on being the "Bread of Life". Faced with people turning away and going home and with just His 12 disciples left, Jesus challenges them whether they want to stay. They do, because this is their only authentic option, to trust

what they have already come to believe, that Jesus has the message of eternal life; He is the Holy One of God. Today's first reading from Joshua also presented a challenge for the tribes of Israel in deciding whether to persist in following the Lord God. They too decided to continue. We may find some aspects of Jesus' teaching difficult as well, but we still believe in Jesus being the Son of God. We may continue to have questions. Belief should come first and then knowledge. The depth of the mystery of Jesus' words revealed during these Sundays in August is that Jesus is God's Holy One.

We today welcome the Coordinator of Education Programs at St Barnabas College, Carolyn Lammas. Her visit coincides with Vocations Month in the Diocese of Adelaide. It is an opportunity to highlight the vocations of lay and ordained leadership ministry in our parishes and in Anglican communities. Carolyn will speak for about five minutes on the opportunities to explore our calls to ministry and to consider this further with an enquirer's day next Saturday.

The Bishop of New Guinea Islands, Reginald Makele will our guest preacher next Sunday at both the 8 am and 10 am services. Bishop Reginald is visiting Adelaide for nearly a week as part of the Martyrs' Day commemorations. Martyrs' Day is celebrated each year in honour of the missionaries killed during the Japanese invasion of New Guinea during the 2nd World War. A service will be held next Saturday the 31st of August at 11 am at St Cuthbert's Prospect, the parish where one of the former missionaries, Lilla Lashmar attended. You are most welcome to attend but also next Sunday at St Saviour's, Glen Osmond, where he will preach. We will have Kids@Church with children's activities on the day and celebrate Fathers Day too! There will also be a retiring collection supporting the ABM Martyrs Gift. The appeal will go towards training people in leadership skills for the community and the church in PNG. On Pentecost Sunday, we launched our involvement in a national Anglican Church program called Hope25. Hope25 is an opportunity to share the hope we have in Jesus and will run from Easter Day until Pentecost next year. There are numerous opportunities to consider how we may as a parish be involved. I would like to establish a working group to prayerfully discern what we may consider. We will need to consider working out who we are trying to reach, on making community connections, on telling our own story (a testimony) and or running an outreach course. If you would like to be involved, please let me know.


Nearly \$4,000 was raised at our Sri Lankan dinner on Friday the 19th of July. \$2,000 will be donated to the ABM's Sri Lankan appeal, while the remainder will go to the Parish. The money for Sri Lanka will be directed through the ABM to the Diocese of Colombo to assist in its program providing educational and nutrition aid for children, and health care and social connection in the north of Sri Lanka. Thank you to everyone once again for all who helped make it a great night, especially Shanka Wijesundara.

Nearly \$4,000 has also been raised through the ABM Encounter Program wine fundraiser. The Shiraz originating from the Triple Creek Winery in the Barossa Valley has almost sold out with just a few dozen left. The proceeds will go towards supporting a priest from the Diocese of New Guinea Islands visiting South Australia at some stage in the next 12 months. It will enable the priest to learn useful approaches and resources to take back to their own churches and well as Adelaide Anglicans learning more about the PNG diocese and the contexts in which they serve.

The rental property at 2A Pridmore Road, Glen Osmond is being renovated in time for new tenants. The Parish Council has approved the cost of having the house painted and with some renovations. This includes new blinds and curtains. The previous tenants moved out in June. The rental from the property helps supplement our parish income and so the Parish Council is keen to have it rented out again as soon as possible.


