### A reading from the book Joshua

At that time the Lord said to Joshua, 'Make flint knives and circumcise the Israelites a second time.' So Joshua made flint knives, and circumcised the Israelites at Gibeath-haaraloth. This is the reason why Joshua circumcised them: all the males of the people who came out of Egypt, all the warriors, had died during the journey through the wilderness after they had come out of Egypt. Although all the people who came out had been circumcised, yet all the people born on the journey through the wilderness after they had come out of Egypt had not been circumcised. For the Israelites travelled for forty years in the wilderness, until all the nation, the warriors who came out of Egypt, perished, not having listened to the voice of the Lord. To them the Lord swore that he would not let them see the land that he had sworn to their ancestors to give us, a land flowing with milk and honey. So it was their children, whom he raised up in their place, that Joshua circumcised; for they were uncircumcised, because they had not been circumcised on the way. When the circumcising of all the nation was done, they remained in their places in the camp until they were healed. The Lord said to Joshua, 'Today I have rolled away from you the disgrace of Egypt.' And so that place is called Gilgal to this day. While the Israelites were encamped in Gilgal they kept the passover in the evening on the fourteenth day of the month in the plains of Jericho. On the day after the passover, on that very day, they ate the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain. The manna ceased on the day they ate the produce of the land, and the Israelites no longer had manna; they ate the crops of the land of Canaan that year.

### A reading from the second letter to the Corinthians

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Then Jesus said. 'There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me." So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said. "How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you: I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his slaves, "Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it. and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!" And they began to celebrate. 'Now his elder son was in the field: and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called

one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound." Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, "Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!" Then the father said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."



#### Father Paul writes - March 30, 2025

Today is Refreshment Sunday or Mothering Sunday, a break in our Lenten fast. We celebrate with Simnel Cake in memory of our Mother Church and our earth ly mother. It is a time when we say thank you to our mothers, but in reality, the word "mothering" refers to the "mother church". It is a tradition from the 16th

century onwards in England when those who were baptised or attended a church during their childhood returned to their 'mother church'. It was also an occasion for those who undertook domestic work or were working in factories to visit home and to see their families and care for their mothers. The distribution of Simnel Cake on Mothering Sunday is regarded as a bit of an indulgence at this halfway point in the season of Lent. So, thank you to those who have made the Simnel Cake and supplied the posies this year.

The Gospel reading today is also family related with Jesus' parable about a father and his two sons. It is a parable concerning the experience of being loved and forgiven. It is about a father who shares his love equally with his two sons, even though one of the sons leaves home and squanders his inheritance. Both sons. failed to appreciate and respond to their father's steadfast love and generosity. The younger son, when he had nothing left to lose, returned home, only to realise his father's great love and mercy. The older son, momentarily blinded by envy and jealousy, failed to recognise his father's unfailing love for him throughout his life and to share the father's joy in the younger son's return. We too are greatly loved by God, and we have the freedom to make our own decisions. Coming home to God, whatever the mistakes or poor decisions we have made along the way, is really a journey of love. It takes courage and humility, as the younger son showed.

The children's music program called "Soundwaves" will be held at 4 pm this afternoon in the meeting room of the church. The community choir is free for school-aged children of all abilities and backgrounds. It is being held on a fortnightly basis and supervised by Cate Hepburn and daughter Zoe. Please take note of the services during the week of Holy Week in the pew sheet, particularly on Maundy Thursday at 7 pm. Good Friday at 10 am and Easter Sunday at 9 am. 
