

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

³⁴ Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, 35 but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. 37 That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: 38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. 39 We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; 40 but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, 41 not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. 42 He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.' A reading from the first book of Corinthians

¹⁹ If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. ²¹ For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; ²² for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

¹ Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. ² So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' 3 Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. 4 The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, ⁷ and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. 8 Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; 9 for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. 10 Then the disciples returned to their homes. 11 But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; ¹² and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. 13 They said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping?' She said to them, 'They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him.' 14 When she had said this, she turned round and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping? For whom are you looking?' Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, 'Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.' 16 Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' She turned and said to him in Hebrew, 'Rabbouni!' (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, 'Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." ' 18 Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord'; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Father Paul writes - 20th of April 2025 - Easter Day



A Happy Easter to you all. We today celebrate Jesus' resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus is the defeat of death and the opening and the promise of eternal life for all who believe. The one who had been dead having been crucified on Good Friday was now alive, He had been raised to new life. Jesus' resurrection was a stamp of approval on everything he had taught and done and said

about God and the coming of God's kingdom. This is the hope we share in Jesus overcoming death and the promise of Jesus being with us until the end of age with the gift of the Holy Spirit, given to each of us at our baptism.

We affirm today that God's love is stronger than death, that God does not abandon us, and the Risen Lord is with us. This Easter affirmation gives us hope in suffering and disaster. Hope does not take away the source of struggle and pain, but it does point to the good news of Jesus who is with us and close to us.

This hope is what we wish to share over the next 50 days with several opportunities offered through the program called Hope25. I invite you to come along to a course to be held over three sessions called "Hope Explored". This course offers an opportunity to know more about Jesus Christ, about his life, death and resurrection. The sessions are based on Luke's Gospel and shares the hope that Christians have, given the uncertainties of this world. It is one of the easiest ways to discover more about Christianity, with two opportunities to join us for fellowship and share in videos and a discussion. The first starts at midday on Sunday May the 4th and the second on Friday the 9th of May from 6 pm. There will be a light lunch served on Sunday and refreshments including wine, soft drinks and cheese on Fridays from 6 pm. If you would like to come along, please register your name on the sheet at the back of the church as you leave.

Also, our regular Friendship Lunch on the first Tuesday of the month will have a guest speaker, Burnside's Mayor, Anne Monceaux. She will speak about her faith in the context of being the Mayor of Burnside. That is at 12.30 pm on Tuesday the 6th of May. This is a regular monthly lunch which encourages friendship within our community and the opportunity to invite others to share a meal. Again, there is a sheet at the back of the church to register.

In the last 10 days of Hope25, we will encourage everyone to pray for five people to come to Jesus Christ and to invite them to the celebration of Pentecost, a time where, as promised by Jesus, the Holy Spirit came to many people. If you would like to be baptized and receive this Holy Spirit, please speak to me or contact me.

As you are well aware, there is a federal election on Saturday week, the 3rd of May. The adjacent hall will be a polling booth. As a result, we will offer a BBQ and a trading table on the day. If you are able to assist with the BBQ and to provide goods for the trading table and help on the day, that would be great.

On the first Sunday of each month, we have Kids@Church as part of our 10 am service. The service aims to encourage families and children to be present and to be involved. Also, we are inviting school-aged children to be part of a children's community choir. The program called "Soundwaves" will run every second Sunday afternoon during school term between 4 pm and 5.30 pm. The aim is to have fun but also the opportunity for the children to present a musical item once a month as part of the Sunday service at 10 am. It is being coordinated by parishioner, Kate Hepburn and daughter, Zoe. Registrations can be made at soundwavesatstsaviours@yahoo.com The community choir will be free for children of all abilities and backgrounds. No experience, skills or background in music is required. We are also looking for new members to join our adult choir. If you enjoy singing, please speak to the choir director, Margaret Taylor on 8379 7227 or 0414 245 303.
