

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs - in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' NRSV Acts 2.1-21

Pew Reflections

Pentecost / Whitsunday C - Sunday 8 June 2025

 Acts 2.1-21 or Genesis 11.1-9; Psalm 104.26-36; Romans 8.14-17 or Acts 2.1-21; John 14.8-17 [25-27]

The hubris that resulted in the Tower of Babylon, and the divisiveness of multiple languages is healed by the coming of the Holy Spirit. People from all around the then-known world suddenly could understand one another as language barriers melted away. From a sermon of a sixth-century African preacher, name unknown: 'If anyone says to one of us: "You have received the Holy Spirit. Why do you not speak in tongues?", he should reply: "I do speak in tongues. For I am in the Body of Christ, the Church, which speaks in every tongue. For what did God signify by the presence of the Holy Spirit if it was not that His Church would speak in every tongue?'

- Lord, help me to speak intelligibly to those around me about you, your Son and the Holy Spirit.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan.

Father Paul writes - 8th of June 2025 - Day of Pentecost



I extend a warm welcome to all on this Pentecost Sunday where we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, which Jesus promised to send to all his disciples on the day of His Resurrection and again before He ascended into heaven.

This advocate or counsellor came 50 days after Jesus' resurrection and ten days after his Ascension into heaven. In the Book of Acts, it recounts the events of this first Pentecost Day when the Holy Spirit descended on the assembled disciples in a rush of mighty wind and tongues of fire. They were all filled with the "Holy Spirit" and began to speak in various languages. The disciples then take up the mission – a mission to the whole world – which Jesus gives to the disciples to preach the good news of Jesus, crucified and now risen.

As followers of Jesus, we never stand-alone either. We have the Spirit given to us at our baptism and it is something that dwells within and among us throughout our lives. Jesus' spoke of everyone having to be born again through water and the spirit. Therefore, we all share the same life, the same saving mission, and the same love. Our strength is the gift of the Spirit who binds us in love and unity as the one Body of Christ.

Today is one of the great feasts in the Church calendar, it is the birthday of the Church where I wear red vestments to remind us of the tongues of fire of the Holy Spirit. As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, let is give thanks for the gift of faith that is given to us, the hope that is in us, and the love that comes from having the Holy Spirit.

Today also represents officially the end of the Anglican Church's ecumenical program called Hope25. It has been an opportunity to step out in faith, prayerfully and creatively inviting people to encounter the hope of Jesus. St Saviour's did this by hosting the program "Hope Explored", which attracted up to 20 people at both sessions on Sunday at midday and Fridays at 6 pm. Thank you for taking part and to all who assisted in making it possible. Over the past 11 days, we have been encouraged to focus on the Lord's Prayer in the prayer journal and the Bible Studies offered through the worldwide ecumenical program, "Thy Kingdom Come". We have also had an opportunity to pray for

five people, for them to know the love of God in Jesus Christ for themselves. My hope is that we have been able to experience more of God's love and for those we have prayed for through Hope25 and in the resources of "Thy Kingdom Come".

The Parish Council earlier this week met and reviewed the Mission Action Plan adopted from the Annual Vestry Meeting in 2023. The Parish Council also looked at some of the presentations at the Annual Clergy Conference that I attended at Murray Bridge last month. They included presentations on what makes flourishing churches thrive, in creating communities of belonging and in missional discipleship. Various ideas were shared at the meeting as part of updating the mission action plan and the diocesan vision plan for parishes. It was decided to hold an open forum for all parishioners over a light lunch following the 10 am service on Sunday the 6th of July. This is not being treated as a formal meeting but an opportunity to have your say in our future direction as a parish. All are welcome.

A new roster is being collated this week which starts on the 29th of June until the end of the year. Please let us know if you will be away or unable to be on the roster for any time between July and December. If you would like to consider being on the roster perhaps a welcomer, an intercessor, a reader, a lay assistant, in helping with the morning tea, in being a counter or assisting with setting up the church for the Sunday services, please let me know or the wardens in the next week or so. I do encourage you to arrange a swap with someone else on the roster if you are unable to be present on the day you are rostered.

The Burnside Interchurch Council is holding its annual quiz night on Friday night the 27th of June, in support of the pastoral care workers, the chaplains at our local schools. It will be held at the Burnside City Uniting Church. Tickets are available by scanning the QR code in the pew sheet. However, I will take bookings and book a table of 10 to start off with. It's always a fun night and for a good cause! Tickets have gone on sale this week and seven tables have already been booked.
