
Pew Reflections

Trinity Sunday C – Sunday 15 May 2025

- Proverbs 8.1-4, 22-31; Psalm 8; Romans 5.1-5; John 16.12-15
- Christians believe that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, that each Person is fully God, and that there is only one God. Today we celebrate this belief which marks us out as being different from other monotheistic religions as well as all polytheistic ones.

Father Paul writes – 15th of June 2025 – Trinity Sunday



I welcome you as we today celebrate God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, the Sunday after celebrating the coming of the Holy Spirit on the apostles and disciples at Pentecost. It marked the beginning of the Church's mission of proclaiming the Gospel to all the nations. All peoples, regardless of race, language, political opinions, psychological makeups, socio-economic backgrounds and any other differences are welcome in Christ's Church! Thank you to all who made our Pentecost celebrations a blessing at St Saviour's last Sunday with inspiring hymns and a beautiful liturgy at the 10 am Sung Eucharist, accompanied by balloons in the church and cake over morning tea. It filled us with some fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Kindness, Generosity etc.

A central mystery of our faith which we celebrate today is the Trinity, three Persons in One. The bible readings for today touch on some of those levels. The Spirit, in the tradition of the Gospel of John, is clearly the continuing living presence of Jesus with His Father. When Jesus meets the disciples after the resurrection, he breathes his life spirit into them and commissions them to continue his mission of forgiveness and peace. The living spirit of Jesus within them will enable them to come to the fuller understanding of all that he has taught them.

Writing to the community in Rome, Paul invites us to reflect on the liberating effect of the love of God which enfolds us when we allow the Holy Spirit to enter our lives. We are given the Holy Spirit, this free gift from God at our baptism and we reaffirm this gift in us when we make the baptismal promises for ourselves at confirmation. Today, let us pray for that wisdom of the Holy Spirit, that delights to be with us, so that we may gradually deepen our understanding of the Trinity Father, Son and Holy Spirit and be caught up in wonder, praise and thanksgiving.

Bishop Sophie Relf-Christopher, an Assistant Bishop of the Diocese will be with us on Sunday the 10th of August 2025 for one service at 10 am. This will be Bishop Sophie's first visit to St Saviour's. If anyone wishes to be confirmed by Bp Sophie, please let me know in the coming week. Confirmation as mentioned in my introduction is for anyone who has already been baptized as an infant and wishes to reaffirm their baptismal promises for themselves. Also, confirmation is available to anyone as a teenager or as an adult who would like to be baptized and confirmed at the same time. It is where you receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, enabling God and His Son Jesus Christ to dwell within you, and to become an inheritor of the Kingdom of God.

New church rosters are available from today. They will be sent out by email as well. We would like to develop a contact list for those on the roster so that you can arrange a swap if needed. They included presentations on making flourishing churches thrive, in creating communities of belonging and in missional discipleship. Various ideas were subsequently shared. It was decided to hold an open forum for all parishioners over a light lunch following the 10 am service on Sunday the 6th of July. This is not being treated as a formal meeting but an opportunity to have your say in our future direction as a parish. All are welcome.

Our next friendship lunch is being held on Tuesday the 1st of July 2025. This is great opportunity to come and join in fellowship with others but also to bring along a friend, a neighbour or two or someone you have discussed your own faith with and would like to invite them to the lunch. We have a special guest as our chef next month, Shanka Wijesundara. Shanka has catered for us in the past with his Sri Lankan dinners, which have been hugely successful and has offered to prepare the meal for us, which we very much look forward to.
