A reading from the first book of Kings

⁸ He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.⁹ At that place he came to a cave, and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' ¹⁰ He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' ¹¹ He said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by.' Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake; ¹² and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. ¹³ When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' ¹⁴ He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the Lord, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.¹⁵ Then the Lord said to him, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram.

A reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians

¹⁰ For all who rely on the works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who does not observe and obey all the things written in the book of the law.' ¹¹ Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law; for 'The one who is righteous will live by faith.' ¹² But the law does not rest on faith; on the contrary, 'Whoever does the works of the law will live by them.' ¹³ Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree'—¹⁴ in order that in Christ Jesus the blessing of Abraham might come to the Gentiles, so that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. ²³ Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. ²⁴ Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵ But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, ²⁶ for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. ²⁷ As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸ There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.²⁹ And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise. NRSV Galatians 3.10-14; 3.23-29

²⁶ Then they arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷ As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, 'What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me'—²⁹ for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) ³⁰ Jesus then asked him, 'What is your name?' He said, 'Legion'; for many demons had entered him. ³¹ They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss. ³² Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³ Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.³⁴ When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵ Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶ Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. ³⁷ Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into

the boat and returned. ³⁸ The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹ 'Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.' So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him. *NRSV Luke 8.26-39*

Pew Reflections

Ordinary Sunday 12 C – Sunday 22 June 2025

• 1 Kings 19 1-4 [5-7] 19.8-15a; Psalm 42 & Psalm 43; Galatians 3.10-14, 23-29: Luke 8.26-39

Today we read a story about a dramatic transformation in the Gospel reading. Jesus heals a man with some kind of mental issue (perhaps psychosis, perhaps dementia – who knows?) in a town called Gerasa. Jesus has power over forces we do not understand and heals the man. Not only does he then 'sit at the feet of Jesus' like a disciple, but Jesus sends him to proclaim the Good News as a missionary to his Gentile neighbours. Those neighbours were 'seized with great fear' but Jesus only wanted the best for them, just as he had for the former demoniac.

- Lord, help me to remember all those suffering from sickness of the mind and all those who look after them in their distress.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the *Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui*, the Anglican Church in Hong Kong.

Father Paul writes – 22nd of June 2025 – Pentecost 2

I extend a warm welcome to you in the now season of Pentecost, otherwise known as Trinity or Ordinary Sundays. The season of Pentecost will continue until Christ the King on November the 23rd. The liturgical colour for the season of Pentecost is green, the reason being that it is a time of growth in our spiritual lives with God, His Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Next Sunday though, we will celebrate two great saints of the early Church, Peter and Paul. Peter was one of Jesus disciples and was commissioned by Jesus to found the church, while Paul became a missionary and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to Asia Minor and Europe. Both were to be believed to have been martyred on the same day, the 29th of June. Also, next Sunday at 5 pm at St Michael's Mitcham, the Diocese's Flourishing Communities Coordinator will be the guest preacher at the Sacred Space Sunday Service. She will speak on how we as a community grow in depth and breath of faith and live it out in the world. The theme of the service is titled "The Times, they are A-Changing". You may recall the Rev'd Phillips took part in our Introduction to Mission Action Planning Course at St Saviour's last year.

On Sunday August the 10th, Bishop Sophie Relf-Christopher, an Assistant Bishop of the Diocese will be with us for one service at 10 am. This will be Bishop Sophie's first visit to St Saviour's. The service will celebrate the Feast of Title of the church, otherwise our Patronal Festival. This will also be a confirmation service. If anyone wishes to be confirmed by Bp Sophie, please let me know or speak to me further. Confirmation is for anyone who has already been baptized as an infant and wishes to reaffirm their baptismal promises for themselves. Also, confirmation is available to anyone as a teenager or as an adult who would like to be baptized and confirmed at the same time. It is where you receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, enabling God and His Son Jesus Christ to dwell within you, and to become an inheritor of the Kingdom of God.

New church rosters are available at the back of the church. They have been sent out by email as well. At the same time, we are developing a contact list for those on the roster so that you can arrange a swap if needed. We just need your permission though to have your contact phone numbers included on the roster, so please let me or the Parish Secretary Bobbie Luks know by return email or by contacting the office on 8379 4114.

The Burnside Interchurch Council is holding its annual quiz night on Friday night in support of the pastoral care workers, the chaplains at our local schools. It is being held at the Burnside City Uniting Church starting at 7 pm. We have one table booked thus far. This is great opportunity to come and join in fellowship with others but also to bring along a friend, a neighbour or two or someone you have discussed your own faith with and would like to invite them to the lunch. We have a special guest as our chef next month, Shanka Wijesundara. Shanka has catered for us in the past with his Sri Lankan dinners, which have been hugely successful and has offered to prepare the meal for us, which we very much look forward to. A parish forum which includes lunch will be held following the 10 am service on Sunday the 6th of July. The forum will be held to look at updating our Mission Action Plan for the Parish and the diocesan vision plan for parishes. They included presentations on making flourishing churches thrive, in creating communities of belonging and in missional discipleship. Various ideas were subsequently shared.
