You say, "Do not prophesy against Israel, and do not preach against the house of Isaac." ¹⁷ Therefore, thus says the Lord:

"Your wife shall become a prostitute in the city, and your sons and your daughters shall fall by the sword, and your land shall be parcelled out by line; you yourself shall die in an unclean land, and Israel shall surely go into exile away from its land." '

A reading from the letter to the Colossians

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father. In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit. For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the

robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Pew Reflections

Ordinary Sunday 15 C - Sunday 13 July 2025

Amos 7.7-17; Psalm 82; Colossians 1.1-14; Luke 10.25-37

It must have been an outrage to the Jewish authorities to hear that a despised Samaritan was being held up as a role model, rather than a priest or a Levite. Levites were members of the tribe of Levi, and their primary role was to serve as assistants to the priests in religious rituals and Temple services. They were responsible for tasks like maintaining the temple, singing during services, and keeping watch over the Tabernacle. Jesus was saying that the entire religious leadership of his day was morally bankrupt.

- Lord, help me always to help others when they need it, no matter what their religious background. Protect me from moral bankruptcy.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Episcopal Church of Jerusalem and the Middle East and for that of Church of the Holy Sepulchre in the Old City.

Father Paul writes – 13th of July 2025 – 5th Sunday after Pentecost Welcome you all as we come together to worship God and to give thanks for the many blessings he gives to us. If you are a visitor, I welcome you; please make yourself welcome at the conclusion of the service.

God's mandate seems straightforward: "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself." But what does this mean practically in our everyday lives? Jesus provides the example in today's Gospel reading of the Good Samaritan to demonstrate what loving our neighbour looks like. In our own lives, on any given day, we could be walking down the street and come across s person on the footpath, lying on a piece of cardboard, with a notice in front requesting money or assistance. What do we do? What can we do? What would Jesus do? In that moment we can stop and bend down and ask the person 'how can I help'? It shows God's love and concern toward others. Just as God is always here for us. There are several outreach events coming up at St Saviour's in the next month or so. Our next Friendship Lunch will be held on Tuesday the 5th of August from midday. This is a great opportunity to come together in fellowship with others in our parish community but also to invite someone else or others too. The cost for the two course meal along with refreshments is just 10-dollars. There is a sheet at the back of the church to register for the day. Otherwise, ring Sue Lewis on 0431 151 552. The Adelaide Metropolitan Male Choir will perform at St Saviour's on Sunday August the 10th at 2 pm. Tickets are available through Clive Waters or in the phone numbers listed in the flyer in the pew sheet. Tickets can be bought beforehand or on the day. St Saviour's will also be part of the National Grandparents Conference simulcast from St Paul's Castle Hill. The conference will feature some great speakers, all of whom aim to encourage us in how we can leave a legacy for our grandchildren and children. The cost is just 25-dollars. Registration can be made through myself by email or by phone.
