A reading from the letter to the Colossians

⁶ As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, ⁷ rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. 8 See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. ⁹ For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, ¹⁰ and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. ¹¹ In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; 12 when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. 13 And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, 14 erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. NRSV Luke 11.1-13

Father Paul writes – 27th of July 2025 – 7th Sunday after Pentecost
I extend a warm welcome to you all, and especially to Jacqui Maynard
who is the Pastoral Care Worker or Chaplain at the Glenunga
International High School. Jacqui will speak about her role at the school
which has enrolled more than two thousand 300 students, and lies within
our parish boundaries. I hope you are able to join Jacqui and us for
Morning Tea at the conclusion of both services.

The Gospel reading for today focuses on The Lord's Prayer. The disciples asked Jesus: "Lord, teach us to pray" and responded by reciting what we have come to know as The Lord's Prayer. Jesus directed to them (and of course, us) to whom we should pray. We should pray to God, who Jesus explained is a generous and caring father. Most importantly, he teaches us for what we should pray. He tells us that we should pray not simply for immediate needs (daily bread) but, more importantly, for ultimate needs such as furthering of the kingdom, the gift of forgiveness and protection from anything that would destroy our relationship with God.

Jesus also teaches us that the One to whom we pray is our 'Father' whose love and care for us is unlimited. This deeply intimate and personal relationship with God inspires in us the confidence to pray with 'persistence' and the realisation that what we pray for is not as important as the fact that we address God in such intimate terms. Prayer always deepens our relationship with God, and this is already an answer to prayer.

There are a number of key events next month. On Sunday August the 10th, Bp Sophie Relf-Christopher will preside and preach at our "Feast of Title" Service, otherwise known as our Patronal Festival. The one and only service on the day at 10 am will incorporate the confirmation of Polly Kasprzak. I do encourage you to come along where we give thanks for the church of St Saviour and as Bp Sophie confirms Polly. The service will be followed by a special morning tea.

That afternoon, I hope you can stay on to hear the Metropolitan Male Choir perform a concert at St Saviour's at 2 pm, as part of our Feast of Title celebrations. Called a Pleasant Sunday Afternoon, the choir will sing from a selection of classical, religious and secular and pop genres. Pianist, Jonathon Wong will be the supporting artist. Tickets are just 25-dollars; 20-dollars concession, which is a bargain compared to their other ticketing events for such events with the choir. On Sunday the 24th of August, the Rev'd Dr Joan Riley, the Principal of St Barnabas Theological College will be our guest preacher as part of Vocations Month in the Diocese. St Barnabas College along with the diocese is dedicating the month to raising awareness of vocations to lay and ordained ministry in our churches and Anglican communities. The services on the Sunday will also celebrate St Bartholomew who was called by Jesus to be one of his disciples.

The day before, Saturday the 23rd of August, St Saviour's will simulcast the National Grandparents Conference from St Paul's Castle Hill. The conference aims to equip and encourage grandparents who have a desire to leave a living faith legacy for their grandchildren or great grandchildren. An exceptional range of speakers will share their insights and experiences. The conference will be held from 8.30 am to 4 pm at St Saviour's. The cost is just 25-dollars, and this includes refreshments on the day. There are flyers, other information about the conference and registration details at the back of the church. St Saviour's has been part of the conference twice before and certainly it has been excellent.
