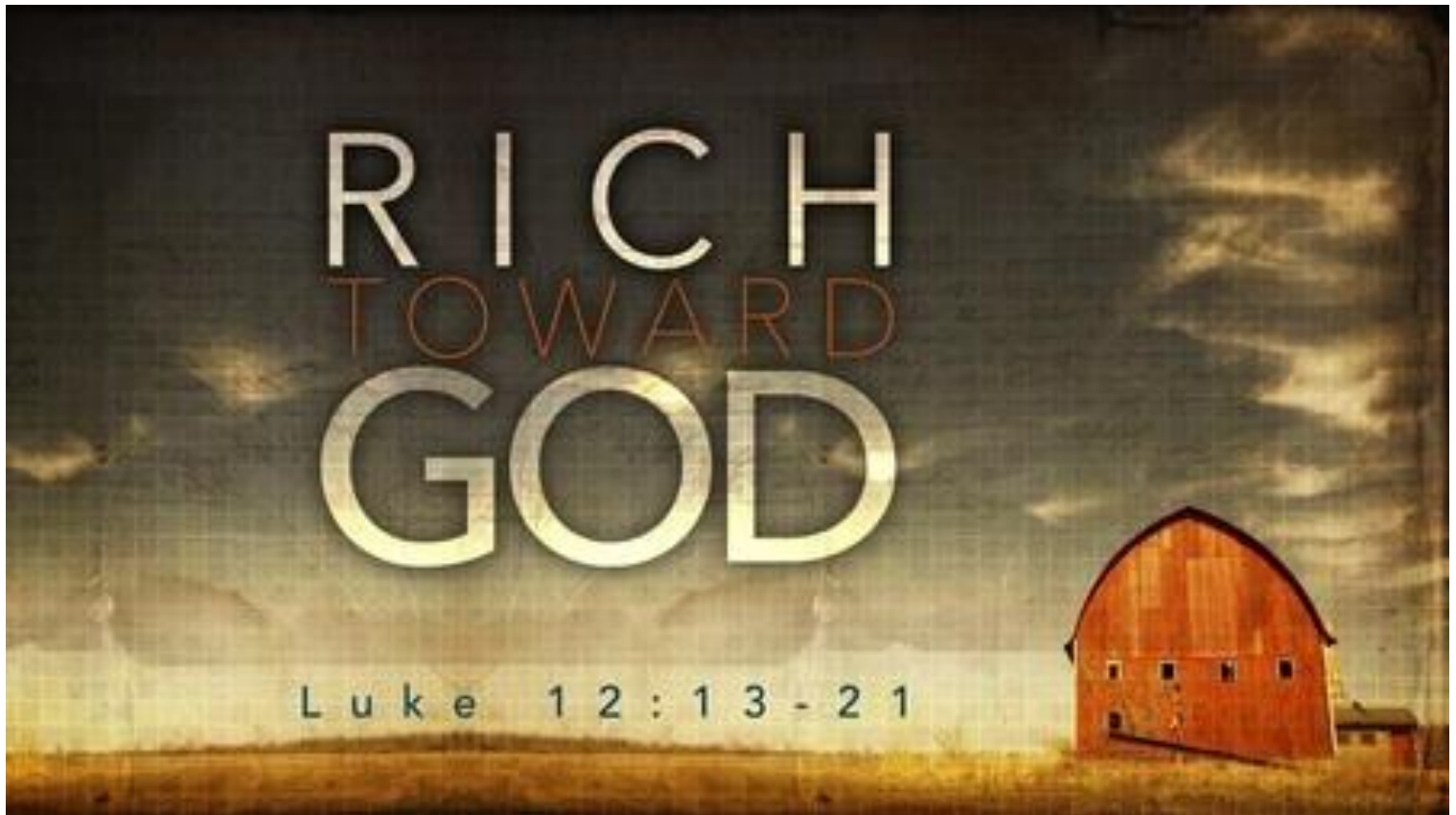

Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher,
vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to those who come after me — and who knows whether they will be wise or foolish? Yet they will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. So I turned and gave my heart up to despair concerning all the toil of my labours under the sun, because sometimes one who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave all to be enjoyed by another who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. What do mortals get from all the toil and strain with which they toil under the sun? For all their days are full of pain, and their work is a vexation; even at night their minds do not rest. This also is vanity.

A reading from the letter to the Colossians

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things - anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

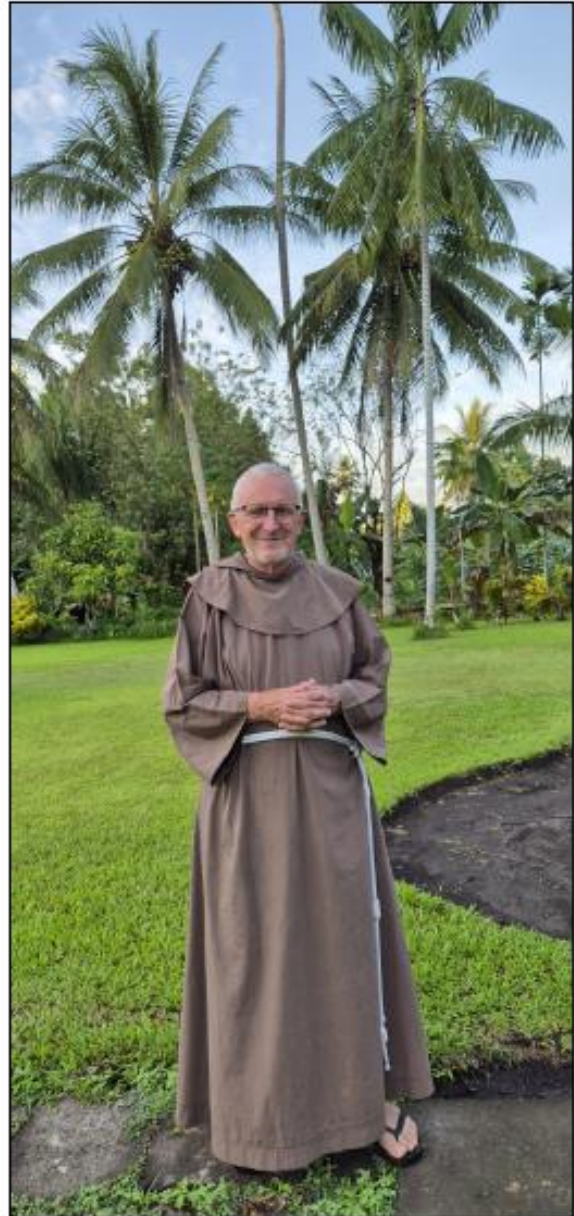

Father Paul writes – 3rd of August 2025 – 8th Sunday after Pentecost

I welcome you as we today explore the theme of our enduring inheritance in the kingdom of God. The first reading reminds us that, of earthly treasures: “All is vanity”. The second reading urges us to seek the things that are above, where Christ is, and that “the life is hidden with Christ in God” (Colossians 3:3). Then in the Gospel reading, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who stores up treasure, but in vain, for he soon dies. Jesus advises the crowd that “one’s life does not consist in the abundance of possessions” (Luke 12:14).

Next Sunday, Bp Sophie Relf-Christopher will preside and preach at our “Feast of Title” Service, otherwise known as our Patronal Festival. It will be our one and only service of the day at 10 am and will incorporate the confirmation of Polly Kasprzak. I invite you all to be present as we give thanks for St Saviour’s Church and to witness Polly being strengthened by the Holy Spirit through confirmation. The service will be followed by a special morning tea.

I hope you will be able to stay on to hear the Metropolitan Male Choir perform at 2 pm, as part of our Feast of Title celebrations. The choir will sing from a selection of classical, religious and secular and pop genres. Pianist, Jonathon Wong will be the supporting artist. Tickets are just 25-dollars; 20-dollars concession. I also encourage you to register for a conference which encourages all of us to share our faith with others, particularly our grandchildren. The National Grandparents Conference at St Paul’s Anglican Church in Sydney will be simulcast at St Saviour’s on Saturday, the 23rd of August between 8.30 am and 4 pm. It does not mean you have to attend all day. Just come to hear some of the speakers when you can. For those who do register and not able to be there all day, the conference will be uploaded so that you can watch it later. Registration is just 25-dollars which includes refreshments. I am sure we have all been shocked by the vision and pictures coming out of Gaza for some time now. The Primate and Archbishop of Adelaide, Geoff Smith has released a statement.....

The abject failure of Israel and Hamas to agree to terms for a ceasefire is contributing to an intolerable crisis in Gaza. The violence must stop urgently and people must have the food and water they so desperately need to survive.

I call for the release of remaining hostages being held by Hamas, an end to military action in Gaza by Israel, and free access for aid to the people of Gaza.

The political ambitions of Hamas and Israel are continuing to cause desolation and intolerable suffering to innocent children, women and men who are just trying to live their lives in Gaza.

The fact that more than 100 aid agencies have warned of mass starvation is a clear signal that this conflict has moved into a truly awful phase.

I ask members of the Anglican Church of Australia to pray and continue to pray for peace and a just outcome for the people of Gaza.

We may feel helpless in assisting. One way to help is to donate to the ABM's appeal for the Gaza and West Bank Emergency Appeal. The program provides emergency care for patients at Al Ahli Hospital (northern Gaza) as well as the hospital's outreach clinic in southern Gaza. In the **West Bank**, the program provides subsidised health services for in and outpatients at St Luke's Hospital, Nablus. You can donate on the website www.abmission.org/appeals

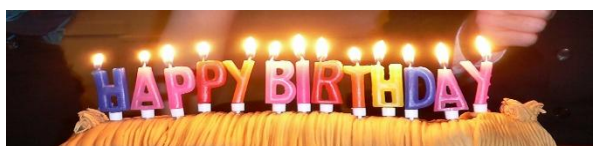
