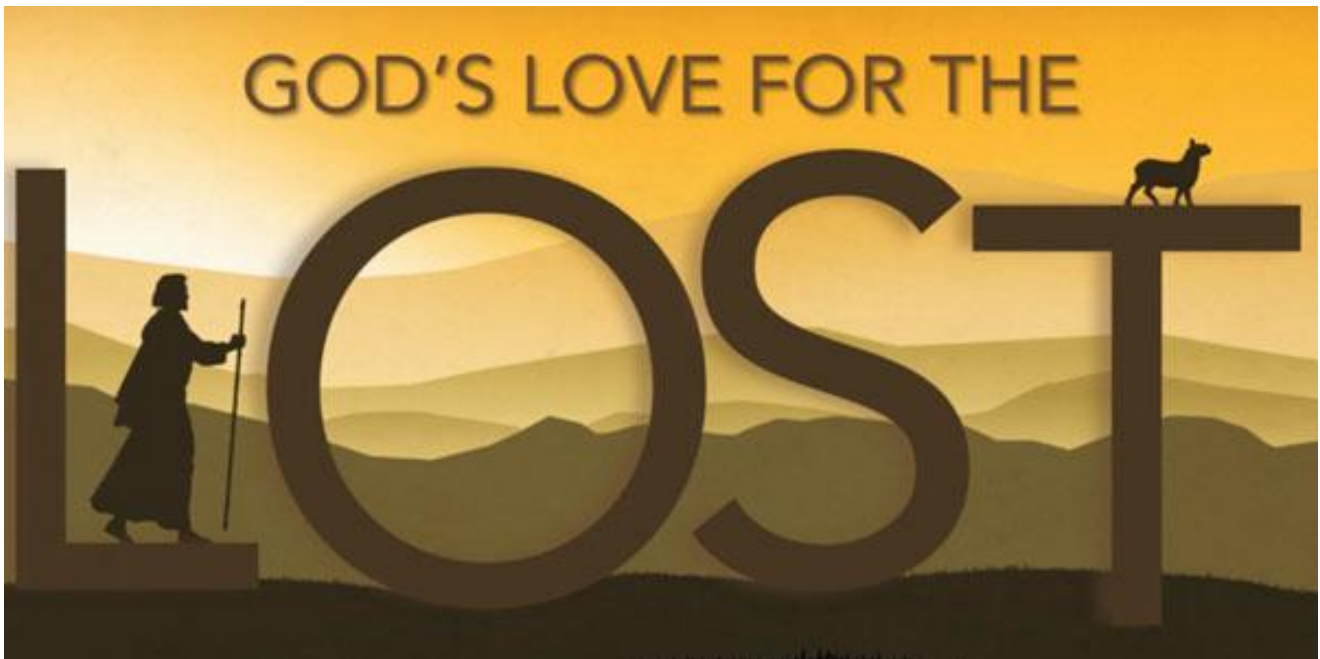

## A reading from the book of Jeremiah

<sup>11</sup> At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert towards my poor people, not to winnow or cleanse— <sup>12</sup> a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgement against them.

<sup>22</sup> 'For my people are foolish, they do not know me; they are stupid children, they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil, but do not know how to do good.' <sup>23</sup> I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light. <sup>24</sup> I looked on the mountains, and lo, they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro. <sup>25</sup> I looked, and lo, there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled. <sup>26</sup> I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce anger. <sup>27</sup> For thus says the Lord: The whole land shall be a desolation; yet I will not make a full end. <sup>28</sup> Because of this the earth shall mourn, and the heavens above grow black; for I have spoken, I have purposed; I have not relented nor will I turn back.

### **A reading from the book of first book of Timothy**

<sup>1</sup> Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope, <sup>2</sup> To Timothy, my loyal child in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. <sup>12</sup> I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, <sup>13</sup> even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, <sup>14</sup> and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. <sup>15</sup> The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. <sup>16</sup> But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. <sup>17</sup> To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen. <sup>18</sup> I am giving you these instructions, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies made earlier about you, so that by following them you may fight the good fight, <sup>19</sup> having faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have suffered shipwreck in the faith;

<sup>1</sup> Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. <sup>2</sup> And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, ‘This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.’ <sup>3</sup> So he told them this parable: <sup>4</sup> ‘Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? <sup>5</sup> When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. <sup>6</sup> And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, “Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.” <sup>7</sup> Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance. <sup>8</sup> ‘Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? <sup>9</sup> When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, “Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.” <sup>10</sup> Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.’

**Father Paul writes – 14 September 2025 – 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost**

I welcome you on this second Sunday in the Season of Creation, a season where we join Christians from around the world in giving thanks for God's creation and to pray for its sustainability. The theme for this year is "Peace with Creation", something that is sorely needed not only with the end of conflicts but an end to the exploitation of it. It is also an opportunity to restore our broken relationships with God, ourselves, with each other and the rest of Creation.

Our bible readings today again focus on our shortcomings as human beings as sinners but of God's mercy to us. The Old Testament reading from the prophet Jeremiah portrays a land devastated by human wickedness. Despite this, God is there, promising to be with those who are faithful to him. Paul in his letter to Timothy speaks of Jesus coming into the world to save sinners while the Gospel reading focuses on Jesus' concern for sinners through two parables. Through the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin, it reveals God's deep care for what is lost and vulnerable. It reflects God's concern for every part of creation – especially what has been neglected or harmed. Just as the shepherd seeks one lost sheep, we are called to seek the restoration for damaged ecosystems and endangered species. And the joy of recovering what was lost, mirrors the hope found in ecological renewal in God's world.

Next Sunday is Stewardship Sunday as part of the Season of Creation. It is a day where we focus on our time, talents and treasure for God. It is a time when we come to consider our giving for the next 12 months with a new round of envelopes beginning on Sunday the 5<sup>th</sup> of October.

**Parish Vision**

The Parish Council will meet on Tuesday night to consider feedback on an updated mission action plan for the Parish. The plan has been distributed to gain comment before it is formally adopted by the Parish Council. The plan is summarised in line with the Diocesan Vision Plan. The plan builds on the mission action plan developed more than two years ago and on a presentation on what makes flourishing churches thrive at a Parish Forum. 

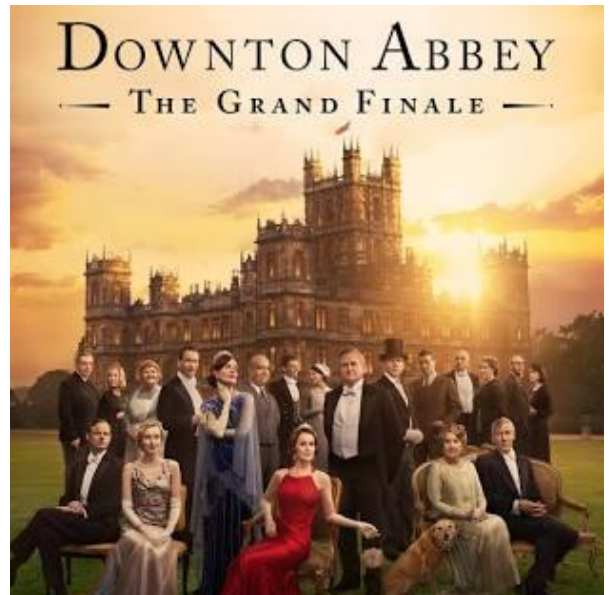
