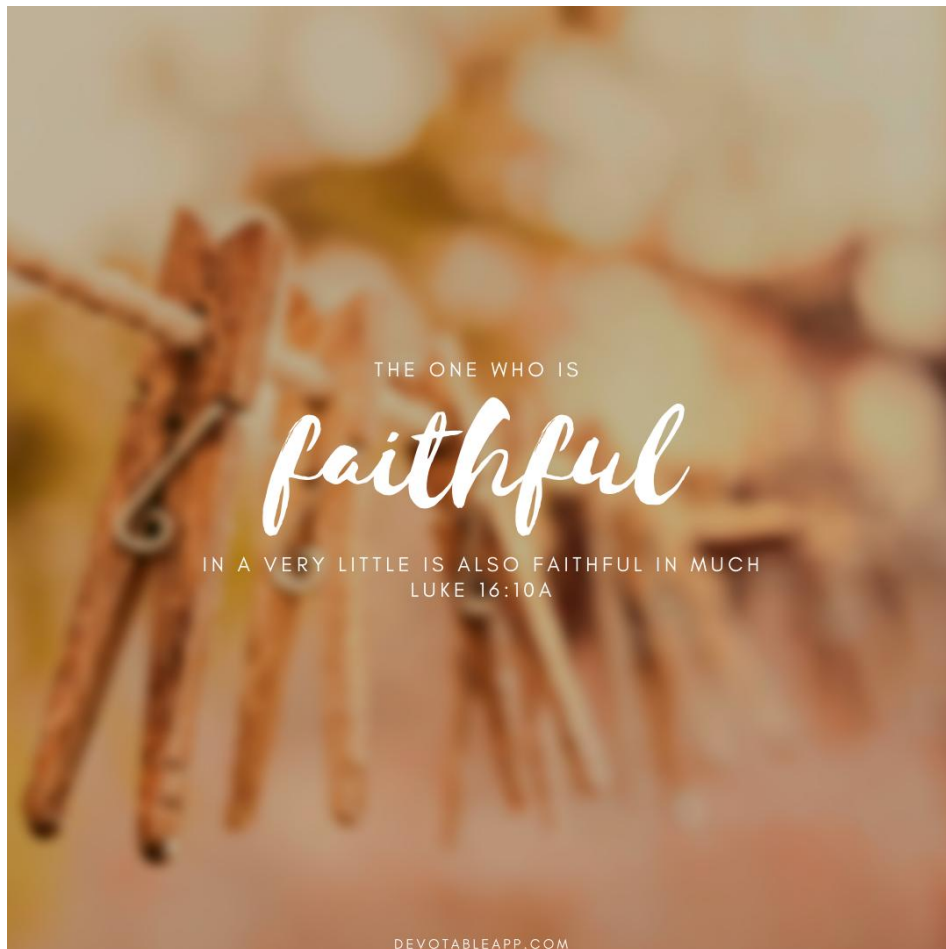

### **A reading from the book of first book of Timothy**

<sup>1</sup> First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings should be made for everyone, <sup>2</sup> for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity.<sup>3</sup> This is right and is acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour, <sup>4</sup> who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.<sup>5</sup> For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Christ Jesus, himself human, <sup>6</sup> who gave himself a ransom for all—this was attested at the right time. <sup>7</sup> For this I was appointed a herald and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth. <sup>8</sup> I desire, then, that in every place the men should pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or argument; <sup>9</sup> also that the women should dress themselves modestly and decently in suitable clothing, not with their hair braided, or with gold, pearls, or expensive clothes, <sup>10</sup> but with good works, as is proper for women who profess reverence for God.

<sup>1</sup> Then Jesus said to the disciples, ‘There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property. <sup>2</sup> So he summoned him and said to him, “What is this that I hear about you? Give me an account of your management, because you cannot be my manager any longer.” <sup>3</sup> Then the manager said to himself, “What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. <sup>4</sup> I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.” <sup>5</sup> So, summoning his master’s debtors one by one, he asked the first, “How much do you owe my master?” <sup>6</sup> He answered, “A hundred jugs of olive oil.” He said to him, “Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.” <sup>7</sup> Then he asked another, “And how much do you owe?” He replied, “A hundred containers of wheat.” He said to him, “Take your bill and make it eighty.” <sup>8</sup> And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. <sup>9</sup> And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. <sup>10</sup> ‘Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. <sup>11</sup> If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? <sup>12</sup> And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? <sup>13</sup> No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.’

**Father Paul writes – 21 September 2025 – 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost**



I welcome you as we today during this Season of Creation consider how we are stewards of God's creation and how we use our gifts to care for this world. Those gifts are taking responsibility for the things God has entrusted to us through our stewardship for our world. Today's Gospel reading challenges us to use our resources wisely, not for personal gain but for the common good, in living sustainably and in doing God's work. The bible reading relates to a servant in not being a slave to money and using it wisely in furthering God's kingdom. It teaches us that as Christians, we are owned by God as we are made in God's image and through baptism, we are claimed for Christ in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. To be owned by God is to be secure in our deepest identity. As we reflect on today's Gospel, it is also an opportunity to review our financial giving to the church, in maintaining our ministry at St Saviour's, given we start a new set of giving envelopes from Sunday the 5<sup>th</sup> of October.

The new sets of envelopes will be available from this Sunday for those who use the envelopes. If you would like a set, please let me know and we can arrange a set of envelopes for you. The envelopes provide the opportunity for a regular pattern of giving, rather than giving through the open plate. Alternatively, there is the direct debit system through your bank account. It is a matter of setting this up electronically yourself or through the bank. As well, we have a credit card facility located at the back of the church, where you can nominate an amount, you wish to donate. Further details are on the back of the pew sheet.

The Parish is going through the process of gaining a new tenant for the hall. A new tenant lease had been signed for the next two years with a fitness group, but unfortunately, they have backed out. Property company, Evans & Ayers which oversees the management of diocesan rental properties has readvertised. We hope a new tenant can be found soon as the Parish is not gaining income through the hall rental at the moment.

I am taking some annual leave over the next two weeks. Hence, next Sunday, we will have the pleasure of the Rev'd Stuart Langshaw taking both services as we celebrate St Michael and All Angels. Then on Sunday the 5<sup>th</sup> of October, the Rev'd Peter Brown will preside at both services. The 10 am service will also be

an occasion to baptise Adelaide Roberts-Gantner. Adelaide is the great grandchild to Brenda and Ray Roberts. Adelaide's parents Andrew and Samantha are visiting from the United States on holidays and hence are using the opportunity to have their first child baptised at St Saviour's. Fr Peter Thompson will preside at the 10 am Eucharist on Wednesdays and Judy Bowyer will lead Morning Prayer at 7.30 am on Thursdays.

Anglicare has closed its Mary Magdalene Centre in Gilbert Street in the city, due to the enormous rental bill for the church welfare agency. Hence, there has been a temporary halt to the delivery of donations of non-perishable food or hygiene items, something we do as a church on a weekly basis. The delivery of donations will resume on Monday the 29<sup>th</sup> of September at the Anglicare SA warehouse at 1-13 Light Terrace at Thebarton. This will be only on Mondays and Tuesdays between 9 am and midday. Anglicare has also asked that donations are delivered in bags or boxes to make handling easier. Thanks to everyone who assists. If this poses difficulties for anyone on the roster, please let me know. Anglicare as I understand will continue to look for an alternative premises in the city.

On Thursday the 2<sup>nd</sup> of October, St Saviour's will take part with St Michael's Mitcham in a BBQ at Bunnings at Mile End. The money raised will go towards our mission giving. If you are able to assist, there is a roster with various time slots on the day listed in the narthex.

And on Tuesday the 7<sup>th</sup> of October, we will hold our monthly Friendship Lunch. Costing just 10-dollars for a two-course meal, wine and orange juice, it is a great time for fellowship and to invite someone else too. Again, there is a sheet at the back to the church. Otherwise, ring Sue Lewis on 0431 151 552.

Don't forget too that daylight saving starts on Sunday the 5<sup>th</sup> of October! Hence, turn your clocks back one hour on Saturday night!

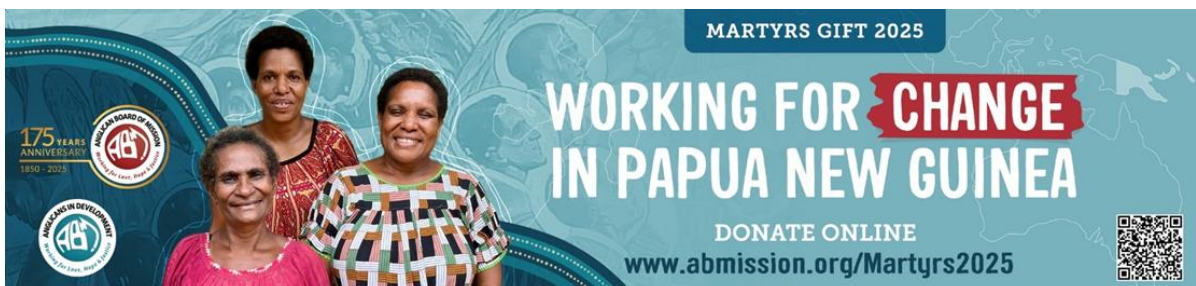
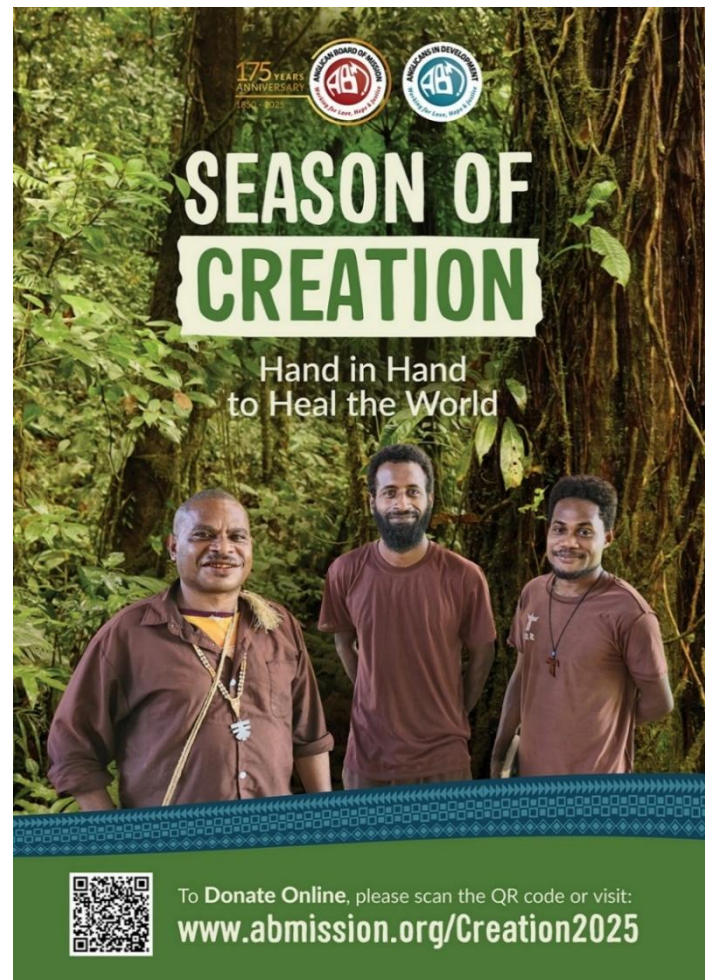
