

¹ As to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we beg you, brothers and sisters, ² not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter, as though from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord is already here. 3 Let no one deceive you in any way; for that day will not come unless the rebellion comes first and the lawless one is revealed, the one destined for destruction. 4 He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, declaring himself to be God. 5 Do you not remember that I told you these things when I was still with you? 13 But we must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits for salvation through sanctification by the Spirit and through belief in the truth. ¹⁴ For this purpose he called you through our proclamation of the good news, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁵ So then, brothers and sisters, stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by word of mouth or by our letter. 16 Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and through grace gave us eternal comfort and good hope, ¹⁷ comfort your hearts and strengthen them in every good work and word. ²⁷ Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to him ²⁸ and asked him a question, 'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. 29 Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; 30 then the second 31 and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. 32 Finally the woman also died. 33 In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.' 34 Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; 35but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. 36 Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. 37 And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. 38 Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.' 39 Then some of the scribes answered, 'Teacher, you have spoken well.' 40 For they no longer dared to ask him another question.

Father Paul writes – 9th of November 2025 – 22nd Sunday after Pentecost I welcome you to St Saviour's Glen Osmond. If you are a visitor, I hope you enjoy our services today. Please stay for morning tea following both services.

We are just a few weeks until the new Church Year with the Season of Advent, a season where we prepare for the celebration for the coming of Jesus Christ as a baby. Our New Testament bible reading and the Gospel today focus on the promise of eternal life. Paul speaks of God and Jesus Christ who loves us through grace, who gave us eternal comfort and hope, and to be strengthened in every good work and word. Then in the Gospel, Jesus in a trick question about the resurrection reiterates God as a living God and that all the brothers and the woman in the story were alive in heaven. We will also remember those who fought in past conflicts, particularly in the First and Second World Wars. We will remember them with a minute's silence and with the playing of the Ode.

Next Saturday is our Garage Sale at St Saviour's between 9 am and 3 pm. The sale is part of the Garage Sale Trail around Adelaide over two weekends. The event is aimed at helping people offer their unwanted bric-a-brac, clothing, books etc for sale rather than possibly ending up in landfill. There will also be plants, cakes and pastries for sale along with a BBQ and a Devonshire tea. The day is a parish fundraiser and so come along on the day and support the garage sale and enjoy staying on for morning tea and or for lunch.

We will celebrate Christ the King on Sunday the 23rd of November. Our preacher will be the Rev'd Deborah Jeanes who has been licenced to be the Deacon for the Deanery of the Torrens, which now takes in St Saviour's. Deborah has agreed to assist at St Saviour's on occasions, which will include taking bible studies. I look forward to her being part of the parish.

Speaking of bible studies, we are holding an Advent Bible Study over four weeks starting on Wednesday the 26th of November. The study called "Caravan", written by the Rev'd Canon Stephen Daughtry features eight incarnational stories set in an Australian landscape. The study will be held in St Stephen's

Chapel at 7 pm for about an hour or so over the four Wednesdays. The study will also be offered through the internet connection, Zoom. Please register on the sheet in the narthex. If you intend to join us by Zoom, please let me know your email address. I hope this bible study helps in our spiritual preparation for Christmas.


