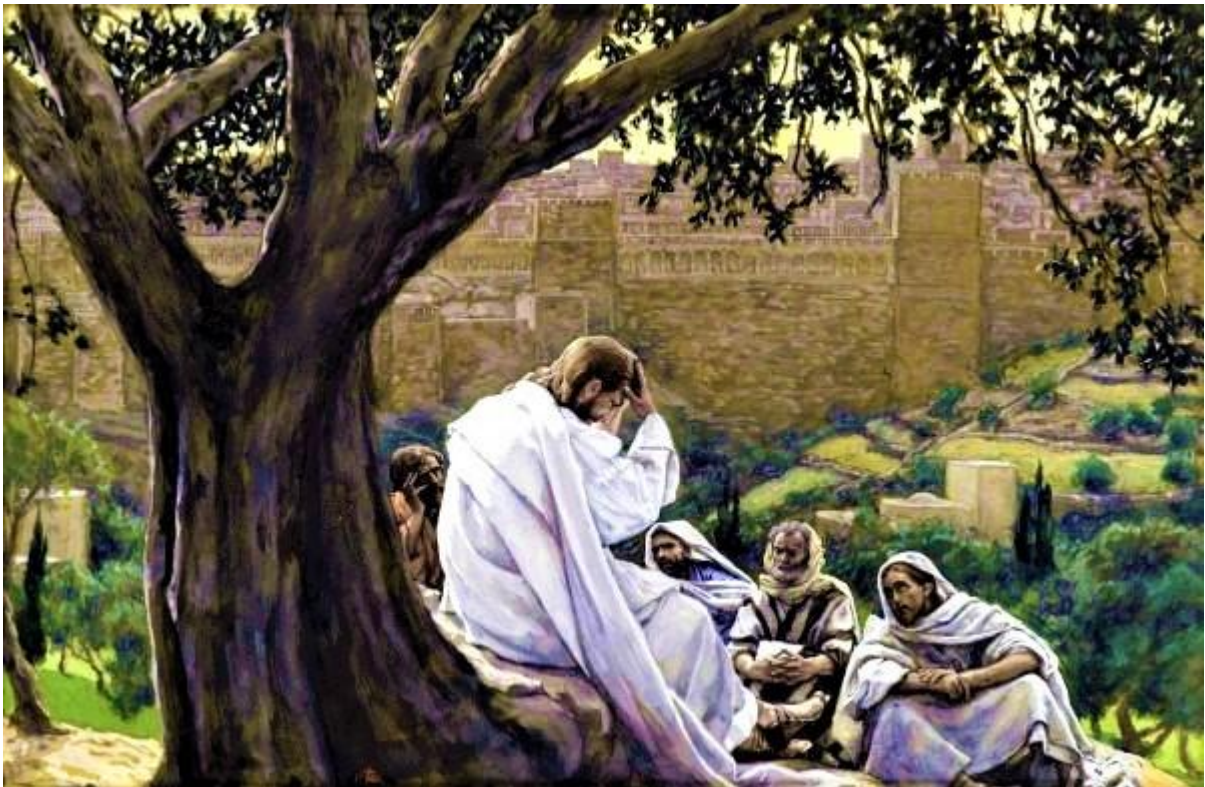

A reading from the book the second book of Thessalonians

⁶ Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸ and we did not eat anyone’s bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹ This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹ For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹² Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

⁵ When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, ⁶ ‘As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.’ ⁷ They asked him, ‘Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?’ ⁸ And he said, ‘Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, “I am he!” and, “The time is near!” Do not go after them. ⁹ ‘When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.’ ¹⁰ Then he said to them, ‘Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; ¹¹ there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. ¹² ‘But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³ This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; ¹⁵ for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your souls.

Father Paul writes – 16th of November 2025 – Pentecost 23



I welcome you to St Saviour's Glen Osmond. If you are a visitor, I hope you enjoy our services today. Please stay for morning tea following both services.

As the liturgical year draws to a close, the bible readings for today focus on the end of the world, the Second Coming of Jesus Christ and a description of a new heaven and a new earth. You could say the readings are 'apocalyptic'. In the Gospel reading, Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple which did occur in AD70. He goes on to address the situation of Christians in a time of persecution and where it will be an opportunity to bear witness to the Gospel. However, they will triumph in the end, provided they remain faithful. Paul speaks of the Second Coming but urges Christians to get on living and working normally while the first reading from Isaiah has a pictorial description of the new heavens and the new earth. They are eternal, and in them safety, peace and plenty will be available for all. It is certainly helpful to be alert in our times. However, as a community of faith, we need to certainly look after God's creation but also live in a relationship with Jesus Christ, with nothing to fear.

The final Sunday of the liturgical year is next Sunday where we celebrate Christ the King and where our preacher will be the Rev'd Deborah Jeanes. Deborah has been licenced to be the Deacon for the Deanery of the Torrens, which now takes in St Saviour's. Deborah has agreed to assist at St Saviour's on occasions and I look forward to her being part of the parish.

As part of our preparation for Christmas, St Saviour's will hold an Advent Bible Study over four weeks starting on Wednesday the 26th of November. The study called "Caravan", written by the Rev'd Canon Stephen Daughtry features eight incarnational stories set in an Australian landscape. The study will be held in St Stephen's Chapel at 7 pm for about an hour or so over the four Wednesdays. The study will also be offered through the internet connection, Zoom. Please register on the sheet in the narthex. If you intend to join us by Zoom, please let me know your email address. I hope this bible study helps in our spiritual preparation for Christmas.

St Saviour's will be hosting the World Community for Christian Meditation Australia conference on the 28th and 29th of November. About 50 delegates have

so far registered. The committee will meet beforehand on Thursday and Friday in the meeting room before the official opening on Friday night. They will utilise the church and the meeting room on the Friday night and the Saturday. Please make them welcome.

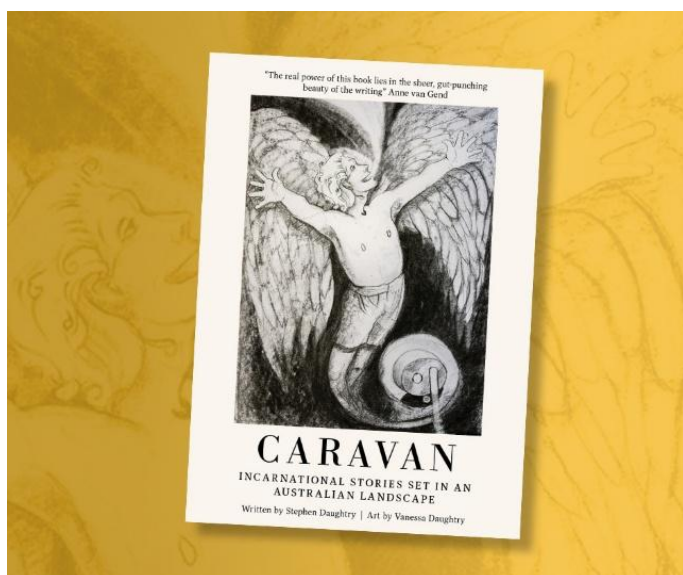
