Father Paul writes 23rd of November 2025

We come to the last Sunday of this liturgical year, and our year-long celebration of all the wonders that God has done for us, which culminates in the feast of Christ the King. In doing so, we profess and rejoice that Christ the King is King of the Universe, Lord of all Creation, and that he is the Lord of our lives, individually and communally. On

this feast, we also rejoice that unlike the monarchies, dictatorships and governments that come and go from this world, Christ the King reigns forever. In celebrating Christ the King, we welcome the Rev'd Deborah Jeanes as our preacher today. Deb has been licensed as a Deacon in our Deanery and has agreed to assist us in our ministry here at St Saviour's, Glen Osmond.

Next Sunday we commence the new liturgical year with the Season of Advent, a season where we prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. As part of that preparation, we will this week begin a four-week Advent study on Wednesday nights at 7 pm titled "Caravan". This ABM study offers a number of incarnational stories set in an Australian landscape. The study will be held in St Stephen's Chapel but also on the internet software program called Zoom if you are unable to join us in person. - **9 months** into the 2025 year, the Anglican Church of Glen Osmond St. Saviours is on profit **\$20,846.54** as of 30th September 2025.
- Note: From the profit, the Church will be donating \$5,000 to the following agencies split three ways:
 - 1. ABM
 - 2. BCA
 - 3. Burnside Inter-Church Council
- **ATO** reimbursed the Church in August 2025 this reimbursement was for **GST** holdings.
- Hall Rent full payment received in June 2025 the tenant was significantly behind in payment. The hall lease was not renewed to the former tenant. Hall vacant since.
 Efforts are being made to find a new tenant.
- Cash flow has been tight, with the Church having to request money from its Anglican Funds term deposit amounting to \$40,000. The Church will look at its finances early next year to determine when the Anglican Funds Management money will be returned.




