

Father Paul writes – 4th of January 2026 – The Epiphany of our Lord

Welcome you all as we start a new year.....a happy new year to you all.

We today conclude our Christmas season with the celebration of the arrival of the Wise Men or the Magi who came to visit Jesus bearing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. They travelled from a far-away country, probably Persia following the star to Bethlehem. It is the way that God reveals Jesus to the whole world, hence the word Epiphany, meaning manifestation or revelation. The wise men are traditionally given three names: Kasper, Melchior and Balthasar. Journeying from the east, they would have received hospitality along the way. May today's feast of the Epiphany strengthens in us our resolve for God to use us to make Christ known in our communities today.

Over the next six weeks, we are being encouraged to have our houses blessed in the season of Epiphany. It has been a custom over the centuries during this season of Epiphany to have God bless our dwellings and use it as a celebration with your family and friends. If you or a friend would like their house blessed, please contact me so that I arrange a time for the blessing.

As we start a new year, I encourage you to think about what you can do as part of a new year's resolution to grow spiritually. We often make sure we are materialistically and physically OK but we often forget about our spiritual well-being and how we can grow in our relationship with God and His Son, Jesus Christ. It can be assisted by coming to church regularly, not only on Sundays but to a mid-week service, in the daily morning prayer service found in the prayer book and using the lectionary bible readings which you'll find day by day in the week ahead in the pew sheet or using the EPRAY app on your phone which is easily downloaded. Also, as encouraged in the Christmas edition of the magazine, downloading the Lectio 365 app, which has great devotionals three times a day. There will also be Bible Studies, which will re-commence with the season of Lent on the 18th of February. All these suggestions can assist in you growing spiritually this year.

A reading from the book the book of Ephesians

¹ This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—² for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³ and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴ a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵ In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶ that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. ⁷ Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; ¹⁰ so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly

places.¹¹ This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord,¹² in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

¹ In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem,² asking, ‘Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.’³ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him;⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ They told him, ‘In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: ⁶ “And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.”’⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, ‘Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.’⁹ When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising,

until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹ On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Book Launch - Leadership in a Time of Change: Essays in Honour of Keith Rayner

Adelaide-based theological publisher AFT Press has commissioned a collection of essays in celebration of the life and ministry of Bishop Keith Rayner. The title “Leadership in a Time of Change” sums up a widely held view of Bishop Keith’s leadership in three Dioceses of the Anglican Church of Australia, especially as Archbishop of Adelaide (1975-1990) and Melbourne (1990-1999), and as Primate from 1989 to 1999. Bishop Keith’s many contributions to the national church include his support for Indigenous reconciliation, the poor and marginalised, and his role in progressing women’s ordination. On an international level, his contributions to the Lambeth Conferences in 1988 and 1998 were

especially significant, as was his long presidency of the Christian Conference of Asia. “Leadership in a Time of Change” will be launched on **Wednesday 28 January at 7 pm** in the Cynthia Poutlon Hall at St Peter’s Cathedral.
