

Father Paul writes – 1st of March 2026 –



I warmly welcome you today as we come together on this second Sunday of Lent to hear of Jesus being transfigured, where his face shone and his clothes became dazzling white. It was an experience witnessed by Jesus' closest disciples at the top of Mt Tabor, on his journey to Jerusalem where he was to be crucified but where he would rise again three days later. It was at Mt Tabor where Jesus was given encouragement by two of the greatest prophets, Moses and Elijah and where the disciples gained a glimpse of the glory of God. It is also where God speaks to the disciples, saying 'listen to him'. I hope during this season of Lent that you are taking time to even more so listen to God through our prayers, our regular worship and in our Lenten Bible Studies on Matthew by Bishop Reg Piper. The ABM Lenten Appeal this year focuses on providing clean water and basic sanitation to three ABM partners, Kenya, Vanuatu and Myanmar. Donation forms for the appeal are available along with flyers containing more information about the tax-deductible appeal. You can also donate online at www.abmission.org or through a bank transfer.

The Annual Vestry Meeting for the Parish will be held in three weeks' time on Sunday the 22nd of March in the meeting room following the 10 am Eucharist. This is the church's annual general meeting, where we receive the annual reports, elect a people's warden and Parish Councillors for the coming year. As well, we will adopt the budget for 2026 along with an ABM project for the year. There will be a brief morning tea before we start the meeting.

Holy Week begins on March the 29th as we celebrate on Palm Sunday the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. There will be just the one service at 9 am, where we will start outside with the procession of palms into the church. The celebration of Easter on Sunday the 4th of April will start also outside with the lighting of the fire and the procession of the Paschal Candle into the church. The service will again be at 9 am followed by our BBQ Breakfast. Plans are also underway for a confirmation service with our new Archbishop, Brad Billings in April or May. If you would like to be confirmed, that is making the baptismal promises for yourself, please see me or contact me as soon as possible.

A reading from the book of Romans

¹ What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? ² For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³ For what does the scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.' ⁴ Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift

but as something due. ⁵ But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness. ¹³ For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. ¹⁶ For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷ as it is written, ‘I have made you the father of many nations’)—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.


