Father Paul writes – 31st of May 2026 –



Today is a day where we celebrate God being three persons in one, that is God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. It is where we remember God's self-revelation through the experiences of Israel, through Jesus and his disciples and the Holy Spirit, which binds us together with God and Jesus Christ.

In our Old Testament reading from Exodus, God reveals himself to Moses on Mount Sinai as a God who is faithful to his promises and rich in tenderness and compassion. Paul in our New Testament reading encourages the Corinthians to live in peace and love and then in our Gospel reading, we hear of Jesus before his ascension speaking of his disciples going out into the world, making disciples, baptising them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Last Sunday, we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It is where the Holy Spirit swept through a large room 10 days after Jesus had ascended into heaven and where people started speaking in other languages of the world. It represented the coming of the Holy Spirit for all people. This free spiritual gift is available to all of us through baptism. It helps us grow in faith and foster a deep connection with God. Through this connection, we find solace, guidance and strength with God by our side. If anyone is interested in being baptised or there is someone you know who would like to be baptised, please let me know. Likewise, if you are baptised and would like to be confirmed, let me know too!

Don't forget the Friendship Lunch on Tuesday. The lunch is an opportunity to invite your friends, neighbours and family and introduce them to our church community. Tickets are just ten dollars for a two course menu with wine and soft drinks available. A reading from the book of Exodus
