Father Paul writes 28th of June 2026

I welcome you as we come together in our worship during this cold snap where winter has really arrived. I hope you are all coping with it. I know for some, they have escaped or are escaping to some warmer weather for the next few weeks or months! Despite the cold weather, you will always receive a warm welcome here at St Saviour's with a warm environment too with our air conditioning system and our hospitality afterwards over morning tea.

Hospitality is very much the focus of our Gospel reading today, with words of Jesus stressing the profound dignity and implications of even the smallest act of hospitality to others. Jesus says even giving a cup of water to a child as a disciple of Jesus Christ will be rewarded. This example of Jesus is a good model of unselfish service. Jesus is calling us and indeed challenging us to live a life of freedom and self-giving love for which we were created. Challenging and demanding though it is, each one of us is called to be a 'little Christ'.

Speaking of hospitality, we will give thanks to our Parish Secretary and Administration Officer for the past 10 years over morning tea after the 10 am service this morning. Bobbie Luks has faithfully served this parish by supporting us with the administration of the parish, the cemetery and the memorial garden, along with the collation of the pew sheets and other week by week duties. Bobbie has been providing support to Bryan Robinson over the past two weeks or so who officially takes over next week. My sincere thanks to Bobbie. I look forward to the opportunity to officially say thank you to her today (Sunday). I hope you can join us. Our parish email and contact details remain the same.

My thanks to everyone who helped support our Pastoral Care Workers (Chaplains) at our local schools at the Quiz Night on Friday of last week. Around 12-thousand dollars was raised to help fund their positions. Barely a day a week covers their role through Federal Government funding, the rest comes from the schools, the Burnside Interchurch Council and the fundraising efforts of the local churches, including St Saviour's with its monthly trading table.

Thank you too to those who assisted with the monthly BBQ at Mitre 10 at Unley yesterday. Much appreciated. Our efforts in supporting our missions continue this Thursday with a BBQ at Bunnings Mile End, in association with St Michael's Mitcham. A reading from the book of Romans

¹² Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. ¹³ No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. ¹⁴ For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace. ¹⁵ What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶ Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, ¹⁸ and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. ¹⁹ I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification. ²⁰ When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹ So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. ²² But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
