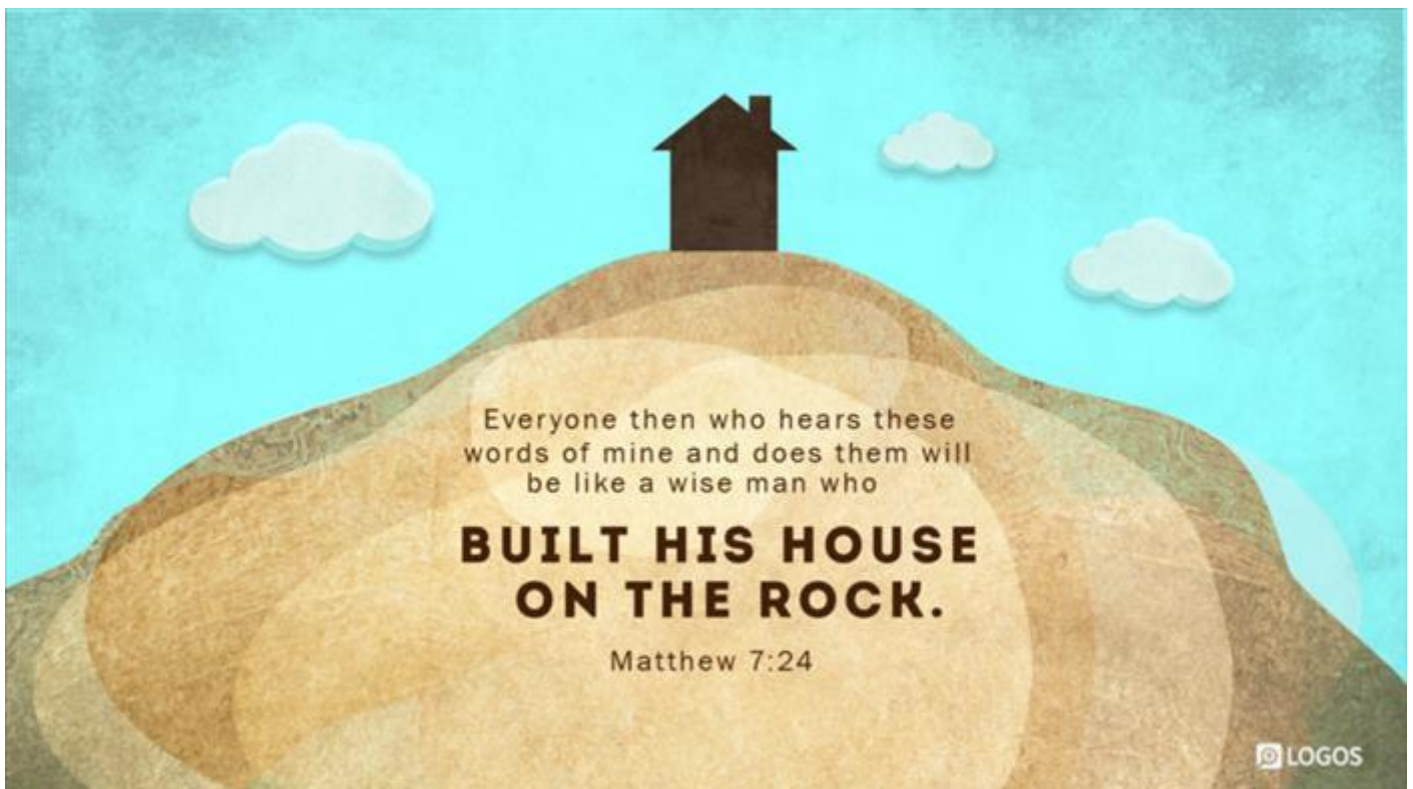

Father Paul writes 16th of August 2026



I welcome you today as we give thanks for the church of St Saviour, named in honour of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. The bible readings for today are set aside for the dedication of this church. The Sung Eucharist at 10 am will be followed by the interment of ashes of the Rev'd Tony Cox in the St Saviour's Memorial Garden. My thanks to the Rev'd Peter Brown for taking the

services over the past two Sundays and to Fr Peter Thomson in presiding at the mid-week services. Helen and I certainly enjoyed the break visiting Warrnambool and the Flinders Ranges.

A Quiz Night is being held at St Saviour's next Friday night from 7 pm. The night is aimed to be a fun night with prizes throughout the night. There are tables of 10, so organize a table or just buy a ticket or two and join in with a table on the night. Our Quiz Master will be Euan Miller. Ever wondered how to share your faith with others with some confidence? Well, St Saviour's is offering this opportunity starting on Tuesday and Wednesday the 25th and 26th of August. The course over four sessions is a module of the Archbishop's Certificate and is being led by the Rev'd Helen Phillips. The course offers a gentle and practical introduction to sharing your faith in everyday life with wisdom and grace. It begins on Tuesday the 25th of August at 7 pm and is repeated the next morning on Wednesday the 26th of August at 10 am, starting with Holy Communion. It will be then held on Tuesday and Wednesdays at the same time on September the 1st and 2nd, the 15th and 16th and the 29th and 30th. ⁴ Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵ like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in scripture:

'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious;

and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.' ⁷ To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner', ⁸ and

Many Christians would like to speak more naturally about their faith but feel anxious about the idea of evangelism or are unsure where to begin. This module offers a gentle and practical introduction to sharing your faith in everyday life, helping participants lower that anxiety and discover that they do not need to think of themselves as evangelists to grow in this area.

Through Scripture, reflection, discussion, and simple exercises, participants will grow in confidence and skill to listen well, ask thoughtful questions, recognise spiritual openness, and speak of faith with wisdom and grace. The focus is not on pressure or technique, but on forming ordinary Christians for faithful, prayerful, and relational witness in daily life.
