The Voice To Parliament The General Synod Standing Committee has published a statement on the Voice to Parliament & the referendum to be held later this year. Adelaide Anglicans Information Update Leadership, Indigenous Engagement And Understanding Your Church

As NAIDOC week is underway, we consider the engagement of Australian churches with Aboriginal peoples & their cultures. We also take a look at how church attenders take on leadership roles in their church. Please know you can use a [Church Life Survey \(click here\)](#), anytime to listen to the people in your church & evaluate your church health.

If you're interested in church leadership, sign up for our upcoming webinar "[Thriving and Resilient Leadership](#)" ([click here](#)) to be held on Wednesday 2nd August, presenting the latest findings from the 2021 NCLS Leader Survey.

The 2021 National Church Life Survey shows a significant increase in Australian church engagement with Aboriginal peoples and cultures in recent years.

In late 2021 & early 2022, a majority of Australian churches (57%) indicated that they had acknowledged or engaged with Aboriginal people & cultures, through at least one of 10 different actions. An empowering leadership culture is a core quality of church health identified by NCLS Research. Australian church attenders were asked about their involvement in church leadership & ministry roles in the 2021 NCLS. We learned that 44% of church attenders performed at least one leadership role. Leadership in worship services (teaching, preaching, music, leading or assisting in the service) was the most common role.
